METROPOLITAN INFLUENCED ZONES (MIZs)

MIZs are categories assigned to a municipality **not included** in either a Census Metropolitan Area (CMA) or a Census Agglomeration (CA). A municipality is assigned to one of four categories depending on the percentage of its resident employed labour force who commute to work in the urban core of any CMA or CA.

MIZ CATEGORIES

Strong MIZ: at least 30% of the municipality's residents employed labour force commute to work in any CMA or CA.


Moderate MIZ: at least 5%, but less than 30% of the municipality's residents employed labour force commute to work in any CMA or CA.

Weak MIZ: more than 0%, but less than 5% of the municipality's residents employed labour force commute to work in any CMA or CA.


No MIZ: fewer than 40 or none of the municipality's residents employed labour force commute to work in any CMA or CA.

Census Metropolitan Area & Census Agglomeration Influenced Zones (MIZ) By Census Subdivision - Alberta







Let's start with Census

here in red.




Strong MIZ: at least 30% of the municipality's residents employed labour force commute to work in any CMA or CA.

Weak MIZ: more than 0%, but less than 5% of the municipality's residents employed labour force commute to work in any CMA or CA.



No MIZ: fewer than 40 or none of the municipality's residents employed labour force commute to work in any CMA or CA.
